Medical Treatment Visa (Uniform Schengen Visa C / National Visa D)

Required Documents:

1. Schengen Visa application form fully completed, signed, and dated.
2. 1 recent passport-size photograph with a clear background and dimensions of 35*40 mm (the size approved by the International Civil Aviation Organization - ICAO).
3. A passport valid for at least 3 months after the expiration date of the requested visa. A copy of the same passport and previous passports if any (pages containing personal data and all pages containing stamps and visas).
4. Travel medical insurance with a coverage of no less than 30,000 Euros, valid for the entire duration of the trip and period of stay in the European Union countries, to cover any medical or emergency expenses, hospital treatment costs, or repatriation of the body due to illness or death.
5. A round-trip flight booking. In case of traveling by land using personal means of transportation or movements within European countries, the visa applicant must submit a letter explaining the itinerary and the means of transportation used (domestic railways or buses in European countries).
6. A medical certificate proving the illness, issued by an Italian or local facility, accompanied by a translation into the Italian language.
7. A declaration from the Italian healthcare facility indicating the type of treatment, the start date of the treatment, and the expected duration of treatment and hospitalization.
8. A declaration from the Italian healthcare facility confirming receipt of 30% of the total cost of the treatment.
9. Documents proving the financial ability to bear and cover the remaining costs of healthcare services in Italy, in addition to board and lodging expenses outside the healthcare facility.
10. In the presence of a guarantor, a formal letter of acceptance and a copy of their identity document must be provided.
11. (For Schengen Visas only) Medical insurance with a minimum coverage of 30,000 Euros covering necessary expenses for emergency hospitalization and repatriation costs.

12. For any companions accompanying the patient, medical insurance must be provided with a minimum coverage of 30,000 Euros, covering the necessary expenses for emergency hospitalization and repatriation costs.

In the case of a simple medical check-up, an application for a tourist visa must be submitted.

Attention:

When submitting photocopies of documents, the originals must be presented for review at the time of application submission.

Documents must be submitted either already issued in both languages or translated into the Italian language.

The list of documents mentioned above serves as a guideline for the public only; the office reserves the right to conduct further inquiries as appropriate and to request additional documents.
